**Barron Police Department**

The City of Barron Police Department is excited about adding a K-9 to our department. To reach this historic event we need the community's help in raising the funds to get the program up and running. We have applied for several grants. One, which would have covered the cost of a squad, has no funding available. To reach our goal of securing our K-9 in February 2011, we need to raise about \$30,000. This past summer our department hired Ryan Derousseau as an intern for the Barron Police Department. Ryan is currently going to the Law Enforcement program at WITC in Rice Lake. Ryan worked an average of 30-35 hours per week, for ten weeks. His duties included answering phone calls, ride-alongs, and filing paperwork. He was very valuable, and we appreciated his assistance.

This fall, our department also hired Logan Olson as an intern. Logan did the same type of tasks, and worked the same number of hours as Ryan Derousseau, and really helped out our department. Logan and Ryan gained great law enforcement experience and received college credits for this experience. Our department was very fortunate to have met these two young men, and believe that they had a good experience working for our department.

I believe that the Barron Police Department will continue to use some of these college students in the future.

The Barron Police Department hired Trevor Peterson as a part time officer in November. Trevor graduated from the law enforcement program at WITC in Rice Lake last year. We are excited to have Trevor on board.
